MESSAGE FROM BISHOP JACOB ANGADIATH

My dear teachers, parents, and children:

Glory to God in the Highest! Amen.

Several national surveys among the Catholics have alarmingly concluded that majority of the Catholics do not believe the "real presence" of Jesus in the Eucharist. Most people, sadly, believes that the Holy Eucharist, is just a "memorial". Indeed, the true center of the Holy Qurbana, and the whole of Christian life, is the Eucharist.

For next three years (2022, 2023 and 2024) the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has called for a Eucharistic Revival. From June 19, 2022 – June 11, 2023, the focus will be on bishops, priests, religious, lay leaders within the diocese to respond to the Lord's personal invitation and equips them to share this love with the faithful through Eucharistic conferences, adoration, and other events. I ask all the Sunday School teachers along with the priests to foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish and mission level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Holy Qurbana, Eucharistic Adoration and processions, teaching, training, retreats, preaching, etc.

I invite all teachers to take part in this Eucharistic Renewal for our Church by following three things. First, I invite all the teachers to read the 9th grade Syro-Malabar Sunday School textbook, which discusses Holy Eucharist. Second, educate our children about the "real presence" of Jesus in the Eucharist. That Jesus is present, "Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity" in the Eucharist. The diocese has prepared few short videos, which will be sent later this Summer to all parishes. Third, encourage each class to spend at least half an hour a Sunday, instead of the Sunday School class that day in Adoration. The teacher should explain to the children and teach them about the "real presence" and then bring them for adoration in front of our Lord.

Revival is not a step-by-step plan or a series of meetings; it is a grassroots call and a challenge for every Catholic across the United States to rekindle the fire of love and devotion for the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus. Let us all join the Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist.


LITTLE FLOWER MISSION LEAGUE – DIOCESAN SUPPORT GROUP

MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH ST THOMAS SYRO MALABAR CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF CHICAGO

Another summer is here, and the children are out of school to enjoy a summer vacation. The children have completed another school year and are getting ready for the next level in their respective academic institutions. An immense appreciation goes to the parish priests, DREs, and the catechists for their affection and the care for our precious children.

We have introduced a well-structured safety training program for our children. Several parishes have adapted and implemented the "Empowering God's Children" program. The goal is to prepare our children to become powerful to deal with unpleasant situations and protect themselves wisely.

As we have already started the student registration for the next academic year, the schools may also be occupied with soliciting new volunteers for the school. We must ensure the completion of the background check and preliminary safety training for all volunteers before starting the service. This process should take place before the orientation session. The background check should be one of the qualifying criteria for attending the orientation session. Activities like creating a Virtus account and applying for background checks are

possible at any time and can be done in the privacy of anyone's home.

Remarkably, the parishes are initiating summer activities for young children. Please note that seniors planning activities outside the curriculum of the Sunday School should follow the guidelines established by the diocese to protect the children. The authorities of the parish and the parents should be aware of such programs, and parents' consent forms should be signed and documented as applicable.

As we prepare for the annual audit by an agency authorized by the USCCB, we request the local site admins take time to clean up the database so that the data reported at annual collection will match the data found in the database. We will be sending out the data collection forms in the second week of July. The audit period is from July 1, 2021, thru June 30, 2022. We will appreciate the timely return of the completed data forms.

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People team members wish you all God's protection and a safe and fun-filled summer. God bless.



CATECHETICAL SUNDAY: SEPTEMBER 18, 2022






TEXTBOOK REVISIONS

ORGANIZE THE VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

celebrations in July. We celebrate the Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle, our father in faith on July 3rd and St.Alphonsa on July 28th. Feasts always present a good opportunity for parents and teachers to catechize their children. Simply combine a celebration with an explanation of the significance of that day. With the feast of St. Thomas arises an opportunity to teach children about the importance of evangelization and prayer for the Gift of Faith. St. Alphonsa led a quiet life. Her life reminds us that holiness isn't a distant concept for the future, but it is something we need to choose now. So, be creative in making connections and have fun with this part of planning your feast day celebrations!



VBS is a faith formation process for children. The purpose is to involve them in the activities that will give them the opportunity to learn about God. It is an easy way to get kids involved in the church. It is usually a week-long event, with sessions lasting a few hours or more each day. The formats followed can vary. VBS is like a camp, with fun and very interactive learning. They usually have a creative theme and include Bible stories, songs, crafts, games, snacks, and more. You may want to call it a "Vacation Bible Camp". Catholic publishers sell VBS kits, which generally include a curriculum, music, and supporting items to get you started. VBS does not need to be complex, expensive, or work-intensive to be fun and successful. Start with something that is doable for you and have fun with your kids!

The most obvious reason for offering VBS is that it is an effective way to form kids in our catholic faith. The interactive learning environment and fun factor not only offer kids a great experience, but they drive home core faith values and facilitate learning. The catchy songs and daily themes stick in their minds, and everything they do during the day reinforces those themes.



FAITH IN ACTION

Faith must be followed with actions that are consistent with what we believe. Just having faith is not enough. Having the ability to believe is not enough. James tells us that faith without corresponding actions is lifeless and dead. In the same way, faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead (James 2:17). Mercy, charity, and love all have a place in our daily life. One must live rather than merely profess faith. One must be a church rather than just attend one. Actions are needed to bring faith to life.

TEN PRACTICAL WAYS TO PUT FAITH INTO ACTION

As we strive to teach kids how to live out the Gospel, serving is a great way to invite them to share Christ's sacrificial love with others. It will help children to live out their faith in practical ways. You can select an idea below or create your own project.



- **1. Serve Breakfast:** Have students cook and sell lunch to church members after a Sunday service to raise money for a charity or mission trip. They'll learn a lot about working together!
- **2. Host a Car Wash:** Set aside a Saturday morning in your church parking lot to raise money for a good cause.
- **3. Plan a Beautification Project:** Take an afternoon this summer, preferable before the feast days in July to plant flowers and remove weeds from your church grounds. Go a step further by setting up a community garden on church property and donating the produce to a local food bank.
- **4. Donate Supplies:** Pack backpacks with school supplies and donate them to schools in your area. This event can be as small or as large as you can imagine.
- **5. Talent Show:** Organize a show for a local nursing home or retirement community. Afterward, set aside time for students to talk to residents and spend quality time with them.
- **6. Pack a Meal:** Organize a morning to pack lunches or blessing bags and deliver them to homeless shelters in your city. Pair this with a donation drive for hygiene items to make an even bigger difference.
- **7. Spread Cheer:** Create holiday or get-well-soon cards for pediatric patients at your local children's hospital.
- **8.** Make a Meal at the Local Soup Kitchen: Contact a local soup kitchen and offer to prepare a meal. Find out what to cook, ask for food donations from people in the Church, and gather at the Church or Soup Kitchen to prepare the meal.
- **9. Closet Cleaning:** Go through the closets to collect items in good condition that they would be willing to give to people in



need. Give it to a local service organization that distributes clothing to people.

10. Mission Trip: Organize a mission trip for your senior students. Varieties of mission trips are available through Catholic groups/organizations.

As we walk together in this journey of life, service Projects help children to develop problem solving skills, social cooperation and to practice the values of courtesy, respect, kindness, and giving. In turn this provides a rewarding leadership experience for young people, and a good example on how to follow God's footsteps. Community service is the giving of ourselves to help others and one of the most powerful ways to show youth their faith in action.

1. EUCHARISTIC JOURNAL 1 - LANCIANO

The Miracle of Lanciano

The Miracle of Lanciano is a Eucharistic miracle which is believed to have occurred in the 8th century in the city of Lanciano, Italy. According to tradition, a monk who had doubts about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist found, when he said the words of consecration at Mass, that the bread and wine changed into real flesh and blood.



We must never forget that when we participate in Holy Qurbana, we witness a miracle and we share in the divine life of our savior. You may use this as a teaching video to bring this realization to our students.

2. BISHOP BARRON – FOLLOWING JESUS COMES FIRST

Bishop Barron on the Demand of True Discipleship

There is something of a 'be all, end all' quality about Jesus. As he says, "Whoever is not with me is against me".

Bishop Barron explains that for a true disciple, following Jesus is more important than the highest of worldly values. Scouring away all the attachments we have, is a requsite for our discipleship.

Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was an Italian aristocrat in 16th century, who became a member of the Society of Jesus, much to the displeasure of his father. He served in a hospital during the plague of 1587 in Milan, and died from it at the age of 23, after receiving the last rites from St. Robert Bellarmine.
